The issue of translation and of transfer between cultures and texts is more problematic when the transfer, as refracted in texts, occurs between a dominant culture and a subordinate culture. This is the case with postcolonial societies affected by colonization and its indelible aftereffects.

Postcolonial scholarship has been primarily concerned with cultural translation, that is, translation understood figuratively as movement between cultures, and has had less regard for language issues, while translation studies has emphasized the complexity of translation as a linguistic practice that involves intercultural mediation.

The study of post-colonial literatures is one of the fundamental areas through which the “cultural turn” made inroads into Translation Studies.
